#### **DIRECTOR APPOINTMENTS**

There are currently five (5) directors of the Nyangumarta Karajarri Aboriginal Corporation. The NKAC rule book requires a minimum of six (6) directors and a maximum of twelve (12) directors (rule 7.1).

Directors are appointed for a two (2) year term (rule 7.9). The current directors do not need to be renominated. A minimum of one (1) Karajarri director must be appointed at the AGM.

Directors are nominated by the members of the group to which they belong (rule 7.5). Half the directors shall be appointed by the Nyangumarta members, and the other half shall be appointed by the Karajarri members (rule 7.1).

There are four (4) Karajarri director positions and three (3) Nyangumarta director positions available.

Directors must meet at least once every six (6) months and govern the operations of the PBC. Directors have legal duties they have to follow, including declaring conflicts of interest and not using their position improperly.

<u>Before being appointed</u>, a Director will need to apply for a Director Identification Number. Information on how to apply for a Director Identification Number is attached to this Notice.

#### PROXIES

Members may appoint a proxy to attend and vote on their behalf (Rule 6.24 of the NKAC Rule Book).

Members must provide notice of their appointment of a proxy at least 48 hours prior to the meeting by filling in the form attached to this notice.

# FACT SHEET Director Identification Numbers

### What is a Director Identification Number?

A director identification number (or 'director ID') is a 15-digit number given to a director of a corporation (this includes PBC directors). A director has to confirm their identity with the Australian Business Registry Services (ABRS) to get this number. Directors only need to apply for a director ID once. When a director gets a director ID they will keep this number forever.

## Do PBC directors have to have a director ID?

Yes, a PBC director has to have a director ID. It is an offence for a director to not have a director ID.<sup>1</sup> Alternate directors must also have a director ID.<sup>2</sup> A person who is planning to become a director can apply for a director ID.<sup>3</sup>

## When do PBC directors need to apply?

You can apply now if you want to. Applications opened in November 2021. But you must apply by the following dates if you are already a director or if you plan to become a director:

Date when you become a director	Date you must apply
Before 31 October 2022	Before 30 November 2023
From 1 November 2022	Before becoming a director (appointment)

The Registrar may give certain groups of people more time to apply for a director ID.<sup>4</sup>

## How do directors apply?

Directors can apply using the myGovID app. This is different from the myGov website. To apply on the myGovID app, directors will need the following documents:

- Tax file number (TFN)
- Residential address as recorded by the Australian Taxation Office (ATO)
- Information from two documents to confirm the director's identity

Examples of documents that a director can use to confirm their identity include:

- Bank account details
- An ATO notice of assessment
- Superannuation account details
- Centrelink payment summary
- Dividend statements

• PAYG payment summary (this is different to an income statement).

Directors can also apply on the ABRS website. If a director (or future director) lives outside of Australia, they can apply using the paper forms on the ABRS website.<sup>5</sup>

## What do I do with a director ID?

Once you have a director ID, you need to tell the record-holder of your PBC. This might be your contact person or another director. If you become a director of a different PBC or another Aboriginal Corporation, you need to tell the record-holder of the other corporation.

## Will directors get in trouble for not having a director ID?

Yes. It is an offence for a director to not have a director ID.<sup>6</sup> If a director does not get a director ID in time, they might have to pay a fine.<sup>7</sup> If a director applies for multiple numbers or pretends to be someone else, they could go to prison for 1 year.<sup>8</sup> These punishments do not apply if the director (or future director) made an application before the day that they were appointed as a director.
